1 in 5 MT Children Struggle with Hunger

New Data Available at the State and County Level

Feeding America recently released a new report with updated data about the prevalence of food insecurity among children in the United States. Their Map the Meal Gap results provide child food insecurity rates for every state and country across the country, underscoring the importance of protecting SNAP and other nutrition assistance programs in the Farm Bill.

The report revealed both good and bad news for Montana. The good news is that the rate of food insecurity among children declined from 21.8% to 20.9%. Unfortunately this still means that 1 in 5 children in Montana struggle with hunger. Sanders County continues to have the highest rate in the state with 31.1% of children experiencing food insecurity, however this rate is down from 35.0% the previous year.

The seven counties experiencing the highest



levels of food insecurity among children are:

1. Sanders (31.1%), 2. Lincoln (30.1%), 3. Mineral (29.3%), 4. Big Horn (28.5%), 5. Blaine (28.2%), 6. Glacier (28.2%), 7. Lake (27.9%)

A number of counties had significant declines in their rates of child food insecurity including McCone, Wheatland, and Phillips Counties.

Client Hunger Survey 2012 Thank You Participating Agencies


The 2012 Client Hunger Survey came to a close in Kalispell on July 24. Every two years the Montana Food Bank Network conducts a survey of food pantry clients at agencies across the state. This survey allows us to gain a better understanding of both the contributing factors and the consequences of hunger in Montana. Survey participants share information on a variety of subjects including their employment situation, sources of income, participation in public food programs, prevalence of skipped meals, access to health care, and frequency of food pantry visits. The resulting Hungry in Montana report is an enormously valuable tool for both education and advocacy.

This year we surveyed clients at the Wolf Point Thrift Store and Food

Bank, Plains Community Food Bank, Helena Food Share, Meagher County Food Bank, Musselshell County Food Bank, Central Montana Community Cupboard, Ronan Bread Basket, Mission Valley Food Pantry, and the Flathead Food Bank. We would like to thank these Partner Agencies for hosting us. We were able to complete a total of 206 surveys! Look for the *Hungry in Montana* report, to be completed by early 2013.

Volunteer Spotlight on Missoula Developmental Service Corporation






Tuesday and Thursday mornings, you will hear cheerful voices coming from Montana the Bank Network's repackaging room. Twice a week, a handful volunteers

Welcome New Staff to MFBN




Leah Ettman, AmeriCorps VISTA

Spicy Thai Peanut Noodles

(using Peanut Butter, item #6241 off Free Food shopping list)

Ingredients

12 ounces linguine 4 tablespoons sesame oil Sauce 1/2 cup green onion chopped 1 cup finely shredded carrot

2 cups frozen stir fry vegetables 3 tablespoons minced fresh garlic 1/2 tablespoon ground ginger

1/4 cup honey

1/4 cup creamy peanut butter

1/4 cup soy sauce

3 tablespoons rice vinegar

1/2 tablespoon chili-garlic sauce

Instructions

- Cook pasta in a large pot of salted water according to package directions. Drain and return to pot. Add 2 TBSP sesame oil and toss to coat. Set aside.
- Heat remaining 2 TBSP sesame oil in heavy pot over medium-high heat. Add green onions, carrots, stir-fry veggies, garlic and ginger. Saute until vegetables soften, about 4 minutes
- Add honey, peanut butter, soy sauce, vinegar and chili-garlic sauce and mix well. Simmer sauce 2 minutes. Pour sauce over pasta and toss well.
- Transfer to platter and serve warm. Garnish with additional green onions, if desired.
